White City Water Construction Update

Completion of Phase I - Zinnia Way and Geranium Pipeline Replacement Project

As part of the District's continuing effort to upgrade and replace water mains and pipes as they age, we have recently completed replacing the water line in Zinnia Way from Delphinium Way to Geranium Street, as well as the line down Geranium to where it intersects with Peony Way. The new 8 inch ductile iron water main should last between 50 and 75 years. Next year's plan is to complete Phase II of the project. Phase I was brought in "on time" and "under budget" by Matrixx Excavation, the private contractor who undertakes a lot of the construction activity required by the District.

Matrixx has won the 5-year contract to perform the work and has consistently performed its duties in a professional and workmanlike fashion. The relationship between the District and Matrixx is one of "owner/independent contractor" and has benefited the District and the water users, as we have not had to go out and purchase the heavy equipment and incur the costs of other governments that perform the work themselves. At the same time, because Matrixx is independent, it is free to perform work for others, such as the sanitation district and private homeowners, without encumbering District interests.
